Choose one and write a paragraph that describes them physically, how they think/feel, and any other important character traits. Provide examples from the story.</p>	<p>Facts</p> <p>Choose five major characters in the book. For each, write what they want the most and what obstacles are in their way stopping from them from getting it.</p>	<p>Facts</p> <p>Draw a character map of the major characters in the book. Include at least four traits for each character, how they relate to other characters, and, if applicable, how they changed through the course of the story.</p>
<p>Events/Plot</p> <p>Based on the first three chapters, describe five important events in the order they have happened. Write a paragraph about how these events affect the characters and the plot.</p>	<p>Events/Plot</p> <p>List six important events in the story. For each event, provide details on the cause and effect of each event.</p>	<p>Events/Plot</p> <p>Imagine the setting of the book were a different time and place. Write a paragraph describing how this would change the plot, events, and characters.</p>	<p>Events/Plot</p> <p>Write a paragraph answers the following: If you took the place of one of the main characters in this book, what would you do differently and what would you do similarly? Explain your answers.</p>
<p>Creative</p> <p>Based on the first three chapters, draw a picture or create a model of the setting. Label at least five detailed from the book. Describe in words why each of the five details are important.</p>	<p>Creative</p> <p>Write the script for a news reporter announcing the events in the book as if they are currently happening.
